| Course Overview: | This course places emphasis on studio work with the integration of art history. Students will investigate a range of mediums and techniques in art making that will help them to learn and develop technical and mental skills that will aid them in their growth as artists. This course also requires the students to begin to use sketchbooks as a way to work through visual problems. Part of becoming an artist is to learn how to offer and accept positive criticism, and students will be required to participate in class critiques of peer art. Students are expected to come to class prepared and on time. Attendance and punctuality is expected in this class, as we will be covering new topics daily. Daily attendance, positive attitude and respect are expected in this course. <u>COURSE GOALS</u> (According to the Alberta Curriculum) Drawings Students will acquire a repertoire of approaches to recording visual information. | | Due Date: the expected date for the assignment to be turned in. This can be determined by the teacher. Deadline: the absolute last day the assignment can be turned in. This is determined by when the graded assignments are returned. In some cases, the due date and the deadline can be the same date. Extensions: students who want an extension must make arrangements with the teacher prior to the due date and must have their assignment completed prior to the deadline. By having a deadline, students who require an extension will not interfere with the timely return of assignments to other students so that the assignment can help students with their learning. Late Assignments: when a student chooses to hand in an assignment after the due date but before the deadline, it will be accepted without grade penalty. It is reasonable to record NHI or MD if the deadline is not met. |
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| Appeals Procedure: | Should a situation arise where you are not satisfied with an assessment outcome, first discuss the matter with me outside of class time. If we are unable to resolve the issue, then I will approach another teacher to assess the assignment. (The teacher will not have prior knowledge of the student's name or the previous grade for the given assignment). If there is still an issue, a meeting will be set up between the student, teacher, parents and administration to resolve the matter. The commencement of an appeal must occur in a timely manner; within 48 hours of receiving an assignment. In return, the appeal process will be completed as soon as possible. |

(A Maximum of one Sketchbook will be provided to each student in senior high art during their entire duration of High school.) |
| Classroom Conduct: | It is important for students to come to class on time and prepared. It is the responsibility of the student to meet pre-determined deadlines. Deadlines will be posted in class and students are responsible for making sure their work is handed in accordingly. There will be no extra class time given after the due date. ***Sketch Book Work Expectations:

*This work should showcase your skills and interests, and is primarily completed at home or on your free time!

#1 Due October 10th

- 1. 2 hours of work (Indicate the time taken on the back or border of each page)
- 2. Create a new cover (It must include your name for identification purposes)
- & Complete a minimum of 3 of the following
- Use items to create a textured page
- Ask a friend to do something destructive with colour to the edges or borders of 2 pages. Do Not Look! Colour a design or picture on each page that works with the borders.
- Close the journal and do something creative to the edge of the pages
- Sew a page (Add interest by combining it with drawings or coloured designs)
- Fill a page with circles (be creative with size, position and colour)
- Fill a page by writing carelessly about whatever crosses your mind. Begin somewhere in the middle and create a continuous path that flows around until a final swirl-like path is completed (Do not use pencil)

Finally... you must add extra pages to demonstrate your interests, skills, doodling or planning. ****Don't forget to label each choice and record the information on the back!

<u>#2 Due November 15th</u>

- 1. 2 hours of work
- 2. Draw a picture on the theme: Child's play
 - & Complete a minimum of 3 of the following
- Trace the things in your pockets or bag. (Let them overlap)
- Create a non-stop line to make a design
- Draw a portrait with your other hand
- Fill a page with positive comments about yourself
- Draw lines while in motion. (walking, jumping or bouncing for example)
- Make a page with hand, finger or footprints by getting them dirty first.
