Welcome to the 2023-2024 school year! We have welcomed all of our students over the past few days and are eager for the exciting year to get rolling. I am honored to be leading this fine group of staff and students through another year of educational adventures. If you have any questions or concerns, I can be reached by phone at the school or through email. Feel free to reach out to discuss anything and please plan to attend our school council meetings to hear the latest in our building first hand.

Our focus this year is on promoting positive perceptions of education and on student success. In order to support these two goals we will be concentrating on the factors of student success and how best to support students and families. Positive and productive communication is key to ensuring that all stakeholders are on the same page about educational importance and elements that are supporting or impeding a student's achievement. We will have in-person parent teacher interviews in October and March, but welcome other meetings as needed to support students.

The pillars of success are

- Attendance
- Be On Time and Be Prepared
- Work Hard

Attendance Matters

Student success is directly affected by students' punctuality and regular attendance at school. Students who are consistently late or are absent from class, miss valuable learning time that can not be duplicated by reading the textbook or completing the missed assignment. Lessons, discussions, activities, group interactions and hands-on learning experiences are key components to success in learning for all students. Our focus on student success has to be supported by parents and students valuing regular attendance and punctuality in class. To promote the maximum learning opportunities for your students we are requesting that attendance at school be a priority. Whenever possible, avoid the scheduling of activities/appointments/vacations during scheduled school time. When we maximize attendance we maximize learning opportunities and student success.

In order to support you in promoting positive attendance, PowerSchool will generate a list of absent students and contact home 3 times a day. If a student is not present in a class, the teacher will mark them absent. If they arrive late, the teacher may not always be in a position to change the "absent" to "late" immediately and the system may still call and email home. However, if you would like to confirm, you can login to your parent portal and see your students' attendance status. If you are ever in doubt do not hesitate to call the school and confirm. If you know your student will be absent, please contact the office with the reason so that we can enter it into our system appropriately.

Be Prepared and On Time

Our class schedule is formatted to support student breaks between classes and ample time to get to and from classes. When students arrive to class with all the necessary tools for learning and are on time, the teachers can maximize the time spent on learning activities. The beginning of classes can be a review of previous material, an introduction to new material and contains essential conversations that can not be duplicated in notes or repeated by a peer when a student is late. Preparedness and punctuality are two more key characteristics to success.

Work Hard - Homework/Assignment Completion, Study

Almost all of the classes will have a digital google classroom that holds assignments, assessment dates and some additional learning materials. Teachers can invite parents to be included to help support students in learning. In addition, creating a PowerSchool account can help you stay on top of attendance, assignment completion, assessment preparation and achievement. Student practice, homework and assignments are the building blocks of learning demonstration before a quiz/test to measure learning. The completion of these activities are critical in the ability of teachers to monitor student learning and progress. Please contact the office to help set up an account if you do not already have one.
