In an effort to support and encourage continued education two of the family members have decided to offer this scholarship to a student residing in the Lac Ste Anne County wishing to pursue his/her studies by attending a postsecondary institution .

The Scholarship:

One \$500 scholarship will be awarded annually to a student who resides in the County of Lac Ste. Anne and who expresses a desire to continue their education in the education field or a field related to agriculture.

<u>Criteria/Procedure for Scholarship Applicants</u>

- 2. Application Content:
 - Application form
 - Resume
 - Current Transcript
 - Project completed based on one of the topics chosen annually.
 - i. 2019: Submit an essay either:
 - 1. Comparing Rural Education from the 1900's to now, or
 - 2. Expand and discuss the methods used in teaching then and now, or
 - 3. Discuss the types of education available through the years, or
 - 4. Write an argument for and against Residential Schools.

Presentation of the scholarship will be made after the student is registered and attending classes. Proof of attendance at the post-secondary institution must be sent to the awards committee at MHS by Sept 30th. The scholarship will be presented at the high school awards presentation or will be mailed directly to the recipients.

Upon completion of their year of study, a brief letter must be forwarded by the student to the school office stating how the successful applicants did with his/her studies. This letter will be forwarded on to the Lac Ste. Anne Historical Society.

Until the Founder and the Foundation agree otherwise, the Criteria for selection of Students to receive Awards are as follows:

- 1. In order to be considered for an Award, a Student must be a resident of Lac Ste Anne County.
- 2. The highest priority will be given to Students entering post-secondary education in the field of **education** or in a field related to **agriculture** or medicine.
- 3. Without limiting the generality of paragraph 2 of this Attachment "B" it is not contemplated that a Student's full financial information must be reviewed by the Awards Committee. Instead the Advisory Committee will identify a method to assist it to understand how an Award will assist the Student to overcome barriers to pursuing the proposed course of study.
- 4. For greater clarity, the fact that a Student receives other bursaries, scholarships or awards does not prevent the Student from benefiting from an Award, but may affect the amount of the Award or may affect the comparison of that Student's financial need to another Student's financial need.
- 5. The process for identifying Students that meet the criteria, will be determined by the Advisory Committee formed in accordance with this agreement and having regard for the criteria noted in this or any replacement Attachment "B".
- 6. The Foundation will assist the Advisory Committee with developing and evaluating criteria for identifying financial need.
