New Writing Assessment Procedures

Assessments are a key piece of evidence in measuring student learning. Writing assessments are frequently permitted to be written outside of the classroom or without secure technology. With emerging technology for students to generate pieces of writing that are not their own for submission, we have devised simple procedures to ensure that students will be submitting their own work for assessment.

- -All writing assessments will be written on secure exam accounts
- -All writing assessments must be written under supervision
- -Students will not have access to internet during writing sessions

Students found plagiarizing or submitting work generated with artificial intelligence can not be assessed and will follow our school policies.

Highlights from Board Meeting - Feb 14, 2023

Fox Creek School 2024 International Field Trip to Scotland and Ireland: The Board approved, in principle, the proposed field trip as presented by Principal Ian Baxter. The trip is planned for March, 2024 for grades 10-12.

Annual Appreciation & Awards Dinner - is tentatively scheduled for September 29, 2023, pending confirmation of a venue.

New Bus Route for Mayerthorpe Area - a driver has been secured and the new routes are operational.

Funding for Dual Credit Programming - the loss of this funding has significantly impacted employment readiness programs in NGPS such as the Health Care Aide program at MHS. Our regional partners have been working with us to identify possible funding to re-establish this program and a funding source has been identified and applied for. We are hopeful that this program will be up and running again soon.

Draft School Calendar - has been reviewed by the Board and administration, and is ready to go forward to the public for input. Once further input is collected, this calendar will form the model for a further two years of draft calendars.
