Highlights from Board Meeting - February 13, 2024

NGPS Vision, Mission and Values - The Board began the meeting by recollecting our NGPS Vision: *Northern Gateway Public Schools strives to be the place where students realize their value, discover their talents, and imagine a future where their contribution matters.*

Presentation: Randy Lovich - Director of Facility Services. Randy shared with us the IMR Projects for the 2023-24 school year. (Infrastructure and Maintenance Renewal Program). The Board approved the 2023-24 IMR Plan plan as presented.

Presentation: Jason Yaremchuk - Director of Information Technology. Jason provided the Board with an overview of the current technology plan in Northern Gateway. At the present time we are in cycle 2 of the four year evergreening program which is designed to keep schools equipped with updated computers for student use. Our schools are very fortunate that all students have access to a computer and excellent internet access. Our technology team continues to work hard to ensure that we are up and running 24/7.
