Assessment:

We will participate in a variety of formative exercises throughout the course that will be based on the specific outcomes as outlined in the Alberta Program of Studies for Mathematics.

Formative assessments are learning activities given to students specifically for the purpose of practicing. These activities provide teachers, students and parents with valuable tracking information about academic progress and where to focus their efforts for improvement. For this course, formative assessments may include daily assignments and pop quizzes that are provided for informative feedback only, and as such, are not directly included in the determination of the student's course mark.

Summative assessments are given to students to evaluate their knowledge and skills after they have been adequately prepared. These activities are used to determine student achievement in relation to the curriculum outcomes for each course. Summative assessments for this course include quizzes, tests and the final exam. These scores will be communicated using percentages.

A student's course grade will be determined as follows:

- Formative Assessments 0%
- Summative Assessments
 - Unit Exams 70%
 - Quizzes 10%
 - Final Exam 20%
